

Part 3: (Re)Start your Habits

Sermon Big Idea

When God makes us into a new creation, he gives us a new purpose of being his witnesses and his ambassadors to the world. So how do we do that on a practical and tangible basis? Paul instructed the church of Philippi to "work hard to show the evidence of your salvation" (Phil 2:12). This means that we have a part in changing our behaviours and our lives to reveal Jesus to the world.

Changing our habits and our behaviours is hard, but not impossible.

Discussion Questions

- 1. What is a change you've tried to make in your life that you weren't successful at? What is a change that you were successful at?
- 2. What did you do differently between the change that was unsuccessful and the change that was successful?
- 3. Paul's letter to the Philippian church is a letter of encouragement. Read Philippians 1:1-11 and list all the ways that Paul is encouraging the church and what he desires for them.
- 4. When Paul wrote about salvation, he talked about it in terms of us being "saved from____" and being "saved into____" What examples can you think of that describe what we are saved from and saved into?
- 5. Read Philippians 2:12-13. Why does it matter that our salvation should have evidence in our lives?
- 6. Read Philippians 2:14-18. Paul gives a listing of practical ways that our lives can show evidence of God working in us. Which one from this list do you want to work on in your own life?
- 7. BJ Fogg, (PhD, Stanford University research scientist), states that prompting is where most habits fail. Do you agree or disagree with this?
- 8. Where could you apply the phrases "After I _____then I will ____." and "Instead of _____ I will _____ ." in your life to give yourself a prompt?
- 9. Who can help you with either Advocacy or Accountability in the change that you want to make?
